



# Rules Quiz - The off wind leg

The off wind leg has the potential for all kinds of hilarious sailing! But knowing a few simple rights and wrongs can steer you clear of trouble. Below we have some typical off wind frolics, see if you can




1. Downwind leg and the red boat gybes before the 2 boat area and proceeds to "luff up" to the green boat. There is contact, who should do turns? Green or Yellow?



2. While sailing downwind a starboard boat sails up behind a port boat and calls "Starboard". The Port boat does not respond and the starboard boat makes contact. Who is in the wrong here?

- **A.** Green was overtaking boat and should keep clear.
- **B.** Blue did not keep clear in breach of rule 10 (port/starboard).
- **C.** Green can sail on (only if there is no damage) (rule 14) but blue must do turns.

Rounding the wrong way.

Rule 28.1: Applies when a boat has rounded the Mark in the wrong direction

This boat has rounded a Port Mark to Starboard and needs to correct herself. However to correct the error the boat has to unwind the original rounding first. At point 5 and 6 she must remember that she has not yet rounded and that she still must proceed to go to steps 7 and 8 to correct the original error. In practice this can be tricky in the presence of other boats - so watch out. No penalty turns apply as long as she did not touch the mark.
